

NAVIGATING STORM RECOVERY IN ROCKWALL





Debris Removal



- Separate yard waste from household trash and place in the front for pick up.
- Do not put storm debris in trash or recycle bins.
- Do not place storm debris in the road.
- Debris from the storm will be collected, but the process will take several weeks.

Traffic and Roadways



- Traffic signals may be down; if so, treat intersections as fourway stops.
- Roads may be blocked by fallen trees or debris; plan for alternate routes.
- Crews are working to clear roads and restore traffic signals as quickly as possible.

Safety Measures



- Stay away from downed power lines and report them to 911 immediately.
- Avoid flooded areas and be cautious of potential hazards and debris.

Where can I go if I don't have power

Power Restoration



- Power restoration is handled by the electric provider, not the City of Rockwall.
- Restoration times will vary based on the extent of the damage and complexity of repairs.

- Document damage to your property with photos and contact your insurance provider.
